TH-526 Comedy and Drama in Western Culture**Credits: 3**

Course Type(s): None

Explores the development of comic invention in drama in relation to social history. Readings in early European drama and social history are augmented by representations in art of early theaters, performances and comic themes. Videotapes are used to explore the development of traditional comic themes in modern theatre.

TH-598 Special Topics in Theatre**Credits: 3**

Term Offered: Spring Term

Course Type(s): None

To equip teachers with the ability to use creative dramatics in the classroom. The emphasis is on the participant and participation. Dramatic play and play-making are integral to the class. Techniques will be taught that can be transferred to many other subjects and disciplines. Students should attend comfortably dressed.
